Currants, smoke, graphite, toasty oak and a kiss of tobacco leaf all define this ripe, opulent, gorgeously pure and layered red. With a big mid-palate, sweet tannin, and a great finish, it's a beautiful wine from this estate that can be drunk today or cellaring for 10-15 years.”* – Jeb Dunnuck

The 2015 feels somewhat cooler than past vintages, still savory in its cedar and cigar-wrapped scents, and spice notes of cardamom and capsicum; but there's a leafy quality to the plum flavors that lends itself to the texture as well, creating a more elegant feel to the tannins. Ready to drink now, it will age beautifully, and you'd be advised to cellar at least a few bottles to taste in five years, ten years, twenty.”*

*“This vintage from the vineyard overlooking the South Valley, is composed of 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, and 7% each of Cabernet Franc and Malbec. It displays a deep ruby color and seductive aromas of blackberry, blueberry, cherry, black currant, wild roses, sweet tobacco, cedar, sandalwood, sage, violets and oriental incense. The flavors are mouth encompassing, with penetrating fruits that are endowed with licorice, dark chocolate, French press coffee and loess and fractured basalt minerals. The penetration continues on the back with pressed berries, roasted walnuts, pulverized charcoal, integrated oak (50% small new French) and fine grained tannins on the long, long finish.”*
