It sports a deep purple color as well as terrific notes of ripe plums, violets, blueberries, incense and lead pencil. Pure, beautifully concentrated, layered and elegant, it's another beautiful wine from this team that's made in good quantities.” – Jeb Dunnuck

“Bright ruby-red. Penetrating perfume of cassis, licorice, chocolate, herbs and tobacco, plus a cedary note that's typical of the site and a hint of blackberry from the Petit Verdot. Chewy, very rich wine with terrific inner-mouth energy and subtle violet, laurel and rose petal lift from the Cabernet Franc. The longest and most palate-staining of these 2015 reds to this point, with the late-arriving tannins coating the teeth without turning dry.” – Stephen Tanzer

“Cabernet Sauvignon makes up 56% of this blend, with the balance Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Petit Verdot. It's locked up on first pour, with notes of barrel spice, dark chocolate, graphite, cassis, green herb and purple flower. The palate brings abundant cherry flavors backed by branny, slightly astringent tannins. It shows a lot more tannic heft than this vineyard is often known for, needing significant time to settle in. “Composed of 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 16% Merlot, 14% Cabernet Franc, and 7% each of Petit Verdot and Malbec, this exhibits a deep brick red color and an intoxicating nose of wild fruits – blackberries, old tree cherries, Damson plums, black currants – with scents of crushed roses, sweet tobacco, cedar, sandalwood, sage, violets and incense. The flavors, as well, are dramatic, with deep, penetrating black and blue fruits that are endowed with licorice, cacao, French roast and silty minerals. On the back, the wine turns chewy textured, yet silky, with sensations of macerated berries, roasted walnuts, moderate oak (40% new French) and mocha, all leading seamlessly into a lingering ripe tannin finish.” – Rand Sealey
