2017 Syrah Columbia Valley

Rand Sealey's Review of Washington Wines - December 2019

L'Ecole's Columbia Valley's Syrahs have been consistent values. This vintage shows a brilliant ruby color and ripe aromas of blackberry, blueberry, currant, black roses, mulberry, sweet tobacco, lavender, rosemary and incense. The flavors are ample yet focused, with notes of licorice, cocoa, roasted coffee beans and earth. The back picks up roasted berries and nuts, mocha and charcoal, followed by a pleasingly ripe moderate tannin finish that is lifted by bright fruit acids.

A smoky whiff takes over the wine as ripe dark fruits and chocolate fill the nose. The palate has great freshness and verve with rich roasted figs, smoked pork shoulder and mocha flavor with shades of tar. Drink 2019-2026.

This estate continues to make classic, impeccably balanced wines, which almost always represent a great value. The 2017 Syrah is a great example, offering classic blackberry fruits as well as ample peppery herbs and floral nuances, medium to full body, a ripe yet also fresh style, and a great finish. It's ideal for enjoying over the coming 4-6 years.

OUTSTANDING

Great Northwest Wine, Eric Degerman - April 2020

Marty Clubb and his team had the luxury of pulling in hand-harvested grapes from vineyards such as Sagemoor's Bacchus, StoneTree and Candy Mountain as well as Summit View and Seven Hills in the Walla Walla Valley. They racked these largely neutral oak barrels four times during the course of 18 months, and the bench trials led to a blend of Syrah (77%), Grenache (21%) and Mourvèdre. It's filled with character and evolves in the glass for an experience filled with raspberry, violets, light toast and sarsaparilla that's rounded off by bittersweet chocolate tannins.

Wine Enthusiast, Sean Sullivan - January 2020

Though labeled as Syrah, this wine is more GSM blend, with 21% Grenache and 2% Mourvèdre. Reserved aromas of herbs, raspberry jam, barrel spice and blue fruit lead to ripe, extracted red and blue fruit flavors. The tannins initially bring some grip and astringency, needing time to settle in, but once it does it delivers a big, fruit-filled punch. Decant, or drink after 2022.
